THERMOMETER SYSTEM

It has been great to see many students responding positively to this system and making positive choices as Clearview Citizens, including many students stepping up and being upstanders. This system will continue this term to provide consistency in expectations across all spaces in Tiramaroa.

Students will also continue working on The Zones of Regulation to support their understanding of the emotions we may feel.



Tiramaroa Support Systems/Expectations

RED ZONE looks like: Extreme defiance and unable to follow any instructions Physical violence and extreme aggression Refusal to follow the plan	RED Intervention: Teacher to remove the other students from the space of learning Send for appropriate support Normal CV emergency procedures apply
ORANGE ZONE looks like: Not listening to being asked to stop or change Disables non-compliance of school rules or Tiramaroa expectations Is not listening after class, not coming to class, leaving A step has been added in RED by a school staff member Intentional physical action towards others	ORANGE Intervention: Direct student to take a break Send for support if not effective "Can you go for a walk, your space etc." If student won't go and argue - tell them we will talk to you at 5PM and have a break Once the 5 PM meeting has gone Teacher will go and see student and they must reflect on their
YELLOW ZONE looks like: Whispering the classroom Inappropriate comments to others Arguing when given directions Not keeping hands/feet to self Disrespectful comments to adults Disturbing others from learning Talking over others	YELLOW Support: Student made aware they are in the yellow zone, understand why and intervene if appropriate Ask if they need help with the work If appropriate, name the behaviour and consequences they are facing at a 2 Offer a break outside of class to regroup and do a "movement break" Record on daily tracking page and
GREEN ZONE looks like: Learning to work Respecting others space Follow directions without argument Engaging in class work Completing the set work Speaking respectfully to adults	GREEN Acknowledgement: Praise like every other student Attendance with CV Values Tickets Positive feedback

Students can be given up to 2 warnings in a block about 'yellow' behaviour before it goes to the next step
BIG THREE: What went wrong for you? What could you have done instead? What are you going to do next?

UNIFORM EXPECTATIONS
