Ako in Team Uranga

Kiva

Last term, Uranga continued the theme of building relationships and through our Kiva programme, worked on understanding what bullying is and is not. We talked a lot about including others with our work and play and touched on themes around being a bystander and an upstander. This is an important part of building Whanaungatanga at our school, so every child feels a sense of belonging and safe. The Kiva programme continues to build on these themes at each year level as your child progresses through the school.

Flips and Tumbles

Flips in Tumbles will take place every Monday for the first six weeks of term (excluding Labour Day). Your child is welcome to wear non uniform sports clothes on these days.

Flips and Tumbles is a physical education programme specialising in gymnastic and parkour skills. Their trained instructors come into our school bringing all their specialised equipment for our students to learn, practise and enjoy.

The cost for these sessions is \$46 and this will be placed onto your school account.

School Absences

At the end of the day, please wait outside the yellow block and the children will be brought outside for collection by the homebase teacher.

Please make sure your child's teacher knows your child's pick up plan especially if it changes.
