
BYOD - Bring your own device

GENERAL INFORMATION...

- **BYOD** devices are able to come to school once your child's zone has completed their learning around digital safety
- School hats are compulsory this term no caps please
- A Clearview PE sports top is part of the school uniform from Yr 5 onwards.
 - * **Rimu** Monday & Thursday (2 shorter sessions)
 - * **Rātā** Tuesday
 - * Kōwhai: Wednesday
- Book boxes are a requirement this year. Students are welcome to use their box from last year if they have one.



Clearview is a BYOD school from Yr 3 for those families who wish to participate. Having your own device is a valuable tool for learning and yes, we use our exercise books and write daily too! Having your own device means that you don't have to wait for a school device to be free to use to support your learning. You can stay logged into apps such as Mathletics and Google Drive too.

Digital Safety

We will kick off our year with learning about digital safety and how to stay safe online. While doing this, each zone will develop guidelines that the students will agree to follow when using their own device or a school device. Once this is complete, students can bring their devices to school and start using them in their learning.

Living in a digital age, being present 'online' is becoming more of a 'thing' and at times a real issue for parents and schools. Below are some important discussion points to consider and we would love you to have a conversation with your family at home about the following:

- is their online activity private? Are any of their accounts eg tiktok, YouTube, Roblox secure? They should only follow and be followed by people they know in real life.
- are they posting videos or content while in school uniform? This is not recommended at all due to the ease of being able to be located.
- you must have permission to photograph or video others
- you must ask your friend if it is ok to post a video of them on a platform such as tiktok. Their home rules may differ to yours.
- are group chat apps being used appropriately? Does your child know what to do if one of their friends starts typing mean things about someone?
